ADJOURNMENT

Regular Meeting City Hall, Marysville, Kansas-August 14, 2023

Members of the Governing Body of the City of Marysville were called to order in the regular session at 7:00 p.m. on the date and place noted above with Mayor Barnes in the chair. City Administrator St. John and City Clerk Holle were also present.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call was answered by the following council members: Frye, Keating, Snellings, Beikman, Goracke, Price, Behrens, and Throm. A quorum was present.

The minutes from the July 24th regular meeting were presented for approval. CM Throm moved; CM Keating seconded to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried by 8-0 voice vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

1. VERNITA PEEKS 400 N 18TH STREET. Vernita Peeks addressed the Council concerning Feldhausen Field and Marshall County Sports and Recreation. Vernita asked the Council to monitor how the property line is sprayed by MSR. She also voiced concerns about access to the ballfield when games are not being played.

BUSINESS AND DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- TENNIS COMMUNITY REQUEST. Mary Kessinger-Wassom representing some of the
 community players of tennis and pickleball are requesting the City name the tennis court facility the
 "Kramer Family Tennis Complex" to honor the Kramer Family who donated to the rehabilitation of
 the tennis courts. CM Beikman moved to approve naming the tennis courts the Kramer Family
 Tennis Complex, CM Keating seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2. MARYSVILLE HISTORIC DISTRICT. Sarah Kessinger Main Street Design Committee member and Wayne Kruse Chamber/Main Street Interim Director are trying to establish a historic district in downtown Marysville from 4th Street to 13th Street on Broadway. This would allow tax credits to be used for rehabilitation of the buildings located in this district. A survey is required to make an application. Chamber/Main Street would like the City to contribute \$5,00.00 toward the survey which will be completed by Spencer Preservation. The Council suggested the CMS Board research parking downtown if they are proposing housing upstairs of the businesses. CM Frye moved, CM Throm seconded to contribute \$5,000. from the Industrial Fund for the survey. Motion carried unanimously.
- **3. CONVENTION & TOURISM REPORT.** Wayne Kruse Interim Director for C&T presented an update on the visitors to Marysville and ideas to increase the number of visitors to our City. He also is working to find ways to encourage visitors to stay in the motels.
- 4. SALES TAX INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT. Marshall County Commissioner Jon Ungerer addressed the Council requesting the City sign an interlocal agreement allowing Marshall County to keep the entire sales tax if the voters approve a county wide sales tax to fund a new jail. The proposed sales tax would cease when the bond for the facility is paid off. CM Keating moved; CM Snellings seconded to allow Marshall County to keep the entire sales tax collected to fund a new jail facility. Motion carried 6-2. CM Frye and CM Throm voted no.
- **5. FARM BUREAU BLOCK PARKING ON BROADWAY.** Farm Bureau is having a grand opening at their new office location at 811 Broadway. They would like to block the parking spaces in front of their business from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, August 23 to serve ice cream. CM

- Throm moved, CM Frye seconded to allow the closure of the parking spaces in front of 811 Broadway. Motion carried unanimously.
- **6. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REIMBURSEMENT 300 CALHOUN.** Raymond and Mara Marquardt are requesting demolition reimbursement of up to \$2,500.00 to remove the house at 303 Laramie which is in a qualifying subdivision and was condemned. The Marquardt's will leave the garage and make repairs to it. CM Frye moved, CM Throm seconded to allow the economic development reimbursement for the house at 303 Laramie. Motion carried unanimously.
- **7. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REIMBURSEMENT 1301 CALHOUN.** Paul Cabaron is requesting demolition reimbursement of up to \$2,500.00 to remove the house at 1301 Calhoun which is in a qualifying subdivision and was condemned. CM Throm moved, CM Goracke seconded to allow the economic development reimbursement for the house at 1301 Calhoun. Motion carried unanimously.
- **8. STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN 611 S 17**TH **ST.** A stormwater management plan for 611 S 17th Street (Kansas Gas Building) was presented by City Inspector Ralph. The plan was reviewed by the Planning & Zoning Commission. CM Throm moved, CM Snellings seconded to approve the stormwater management plan for 611 S 17th Street. Motion carried unanimously.

NOTICES AND HEARINGS:

- 1. RESOLUTION 2023-42 NUISANCE AT 1005 CALHOUN STREET. Code Enforcement Officer Stock presented pictures and the Notice of Violation for 1005 Calhoun Street owned by Natasha Mett. Natasha Mett did not request a hearing, nor did she appear on April 10, 2023. CM Throm moved, CM Keating seconded to approve Resolution 2023-42 setting a deadline of August 26, 2023, for the owner to abate the nuisance. Following August 26, the City will abate the nuisance and assess the costs to Natasha Mett. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2. CONDEMNATION HEARING 708 CALHOUN (RICHRD BRYAN). Mayor Barnes conducted a condemnation hearing on the property owned by Richard Bryan located at 708 Calhoun. BI Ralph reported Richard was out of town and would be returning at the end of August. Richard asked for an extension to complete paperwork for an Economic Development Reimbursement to remove the structure. CM Throm moved, CM Keating seconded to extend the demolition date to September 6, 2023. Motion carried unanimously.
- **3. CONDEMNATION HEARING 511 N 8th STREET (PATRICIA WASSENBERG).** BI Ralph reported the structure on this property has been removed.

AGENDA. The Consent Agenda was presented for consideration. CM Throm moved; CM Beikman seconded to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Consent Agenda consisted of the following:

1. Cash balances in funds were presented as well as outstanding debt and receivable balances. Revenue/Expenditure Budget Reports through July 2023 showed unadjusted accumulated revenues in the General Fund of \$2,533,887 or 89% of budget; Water Revenue Fund, \$494,451 or 55% of budget, Sewer Revenue Fund, \$449,123 or 58% of budget. Unadjusted statement of expenditures

- in the General Fund totaled \$1,864,065 or 58% of budget, Water Revenue Fund, \$478,879 or 37% of budget, and Sewer Revenue Fund, \$375,389 or 27% of budget.
- 2. The Municipal Judge's Report for July showed \$2,407.50 being deposited with the City Treasurer and \$411.50 being forwarded to the State Treasurer for Judicial Branch Education, court costs and law enforcement training.

APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE NO. 3803

- 1. Claims against the funds of the City were submitted for Council consideration as follows: General Fund, \$227,498.13; Water Revenue Fund, \$31,575.63; Sewage Revenue Fund, \$18,619.36; Bond & Interest Account #1A Fund, \$24,689.78; Library Revolving Fund, \$13,862.30; Swim Pool Sales Tax, \$30,155.93; Koester Block Maintenance, \$2,346.12; Employee Benefit, \$18,409.26; Transient Guest Tax, \$2,425.75; Sales Tax Improvements, \$94,492.88; making a total of \$464,075.14.
- **2.** An appropriations ordinance was introduced and considered to honor claims against the funds of the City as audited by the Finance Committee. CM Throm moved; CM Beikman seconded to approve the appropriations ordinance totaling \$464,075.14.
- **3.** Motion to approve the appropriations ordinance carried by 8-0 roll call vote. City Clerk Holle assigned Ordinance No. 3803.

STAFF REPORTS:

CITY ADMINISTRATOR:

- 1. **VERIZON CELLPHONE TOWER.** CA St. John presented a cell tower agreement with Verizon to place a 185' tower on City property on S 17th Street in the Industrial Park. Verizon Wireless would lease the land south of the Water Plant for \$11,400 a year with a 5% increase in rent every 5 years. CM Keating moved, CM Throm seconded to approve the agreement with Verizon Wireless upon approval of the Planning & Zoning Commission. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2. FINANCIALS. CA St. John updated the Governing Body on the status of the General Fund, Water Revenue Fund, Sewer Revenue Fund and Sales Tax Improvement Fund. A Capital Projects report was also included.
- **3. LKM CONFERENCE.** CA St. John reminded the Council the League of Kansas Municipalities will have their conference October 7-9 in Wichita if anyone is interested in attending.

MERT OTT ADDRESSED THE COUNCIL. Mert Ott gave his opinion on the proposed Marshall County jail. Mert then asked about sales tax charged on vehicles purchased locally.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS:

STREET:

1. 6TH & KOESTER CATCH BASIN. CM Throm asked when the catch basin on the corner of 6th and Koester Street will be completed. There have been new storm sewer pipes installed and the hole has been open for 9 months.

- 2. WATER PROJECT ON N 10TH STREET. CM Snellings said there was a water leak on N 10th or 11th that began several months ago and has not been completed.
- **3. JAYHAWK ROAD MILLINGS.** CM Keating reported the millings applied to Jayhawk Road looks promising.
- **4. 700 CALHOUN.** CM Snellings said if the millings work on Jayhawk Road she would like to see them applied to N. 7th Street. She also asked about replacing the curb at 700 Calhoun.
- **5. 11**TH **AND 12**TH**ROAD.** The Council asked if there is an update on the engineering on 12th Road and Keystone. Also, the status of the easements needed to complete 11th Road was discussed.
- **6. PAINTING MARKINGS ON NORTH STREET.** CM Frye asked if the City could paint traffic markings on the corner of North Street and 11th Road for pedestrians.

WATER & WASTEWATER:

- 1. **CATCH BASIN N 10TH STREET.** CM Frye asked if the catch basin on the NW corner of 10th and Center could be repaired.
- 2. **MARQUARDT INSURANCE CLAIM.** CM Snellings reported the sewer back-up claim by Marquardt's had not been answered by the insurance company.
- 3. **WELLS.** CM Throm asked for a report on the levels of the wells in the City well field.

PARKS & RECREATION:

- 1. **KOESTER HOUSE MUSEUM.** CM Snellings asked if the Koester Museum heat was ready for the winter. The heat has been repaired on the main floor and all the pipes are broken upstairs so the heat upstairs has not been completed.
- **2. POOL REPAIRS.** CM Price asked about the pool repairs. CA St. John said Manhattan Energy Center had arrived today and were accessing the repairs that are needed.
- **3. CITY PARK RESTROOMS.** CM Beikman asked about the condition of the City Park restrooms. A renovation was included in the 2024 budget.

CEMETERY/AIRPORT:

1. CEMETERY FLOWERS. CM Beikman reminded citizens that all flowers and decorative devices on graves need to be removed by June 10th after Memorial Day.

POLICE AND FIRE:

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE:

- **1. CONVENTION & TOURISM DIRECTOR.** CM Behrens reported she and the Mayor met July 27th with Convention & Tourism members and Chamber/Main Street members to begin setting a job description and advertising for a director. Creating an executive committee consisting of 2 members from each organization to oversee this employee.
- 2. **KOESTER BLOCK RENTALS.** CM Frye asked if the Koester Block apartment and building on Elm had been advertised. The pop up shop during the Christmas Holiday would like to use the building on Elm.

WHEREAS the Revenue Neutral Rate for the City of Marysville was calculated as 63.866 mills by the Marshall County Clerk; and

WHEREAS the budget proposed by the Governing Body of the City of Marysville will require the levy of a property tax rate exceeding the Revenue Neutral Rate; and

WHEREAS the Governing Body held a hearing on August 28, 2023, allowing all interested taxpayers desiring to be heard an opportunity to give oral testimony; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Marysville, having heard testimony, still finds it necessary to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF MARYSVILLE:

The City of Marysville shall levy a property tax rate of 68.631 mills which exceeds the Revenue Neutral Rate.

This resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and shall remain in effect until future action is taken by the Governing Body.

PROCEDURE FOR AUCTION AND DISPOSITION OF NUISANCE VEHICLES REMOVED FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY TO ABATE SUCH NUISANCE

In accordance with K.S.A. 8-1102, the following procedure is adopted by the Governing Body of the City of Marysville for the sale by public auction and disposition of nuisance vehicles that have been removed from private property by resolution duly approved by the Governing Body of the City of Marysville and accordingly deemed abandoned for purposes of disposition hereunder:

- 1. The City Administrator shall administer the procedure established herein. The City Administrator may assign or designate a specific Staff member to carry-out the tasks necessary for the disposition of nuisance vehicles in accordance with K.S.A. 8-1102. The procedure adopted by the Governing Body shall be applied prospectively and shall apply to vehicles towed after the adoption date, including vehicles towed pursuant to the nuisance resolutions adopted by the Governing Body on August 28, 2023. The procedure shall not be applicable retroactively to any nuisance vehicle previously towed or removed by a towing service.
- 2. The City Administrator or the designee shall promptly notify the towing service operator in writing that the City is disposing of the towed vehicle in accordance with K.S.A. 8-1102 and that the towing service must submit a billing statement to the City for towing services and storage fees prior to the auction (sale) date. The City of Marysville shall make payment for the towing services and storage fees and seek reimbursement from the owner. The vehicle must be impounded for at least 30 days before it can be sold by public auction.
 - A) The City Administrator is authorized to negotiate storage or impound fees with towing service operators. The City Administrator is further authorized to evaluate whether the City of Marysville should establish its own impound lot.
- 3. The City Administrator or the designee shall promptly apply for proof of verification of vehicle ownership record (verification must be applied for not more than 30 days after impoundment).
 - A) See attached form VCO-TRDL-302, request vehicle registration record only, presently it costs \$15.
- 4. The City Administrator or the designee shall mail notice by certified mail to the owner(s) and lienholder(s) listed in the vehicle ownership

record that if the removal and storage charges incurred are not paid within 15 days from the date of the mailing of the notice, the vehicle will be sold by the City of Marysville at public auction to the highest bidder for cash.

- A) The 15-day Notice must be mailed within 10 days after receipt by the City Administrator or the designee of the verification of the last owner and any lienholders, if any.
- B) The returned receipt (i.e. green card) should be retained as proof of mailing by certified mail. If the Post Office does not provide the return receipt (or green card), the certified mail receipt should be retained as proof of mailing.
- C) The City Administrator or the designee shall attempt to personally serve the owner(s) of the notice. The City Administrator or the designee may use the city police to assist in personal service of notice on the owner(s).
- D) A sample 15-Day notice is attached.
- 5. The City Administrator or the designee shall publish notice in the city newspaper one time per week for 2 consecutive weeks, commencing at least 15 days after the date of the mailing of the notice to the owner(s) and lienholder(s).
 - A) The publication notice shall describe the motor vehicle by name of make, year, model, color, and serial number (VIN), and shall state that it was impounded by the City and that it will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash if the owner does not claim it within 10 days of the second publication and pay the removal, storage and publication costs incurred by the City.
 - B) The notice shall also include the date and location of the auction.

- C) The City Administrator or the designee shall request a publisher's affidavit to show proof of publication.
- D) A sample publication notice is attached.
- 6. To claim the vehicle, the owner must provide proof of valid registration and ownership. The owner must also pay for all of the transportation, storage and publication costs incurred by the City of Marysville by no later than the date and time of the auction. Such payment shall be made by certified monies or cashier's check. Inoperable vehicles that are returned to the same location by the owner or to the same location where the nuisance vehicle was situated may result in the owner being ticketed by the City of Marysville for maintaining nuisance vehicle(s). The owner, for good cause, may be granted 30 days after the vehicle is released to the owner in which to make the inoperable vehicle operable as defined by the Marysville City Code before such owner is ticketed for maintaining a nuisance vehicle.
- 7. If the vehicle is not claimed by the owner or lienholder, the City Administrator or the designee may proceed with the sale of the vehicle at public auction to the highest bidder for cash. If sold, the City Administrator or the designee shall provide the purchaser an Abandoned Vehicle Affidavit together with: (i) proof of verification of vehicle ownership record, (ii) proof of mailing of 15-day notice by certified mail to the last registered owner and lienholder(s), if applicable; (iii) proof of publication of notice of public auction during a two consecutive week period; and (iv) odometer disclosure statement form TR-59, promulgated by the Kansas Department of Revenue.
 - A) The City Administrator or the designee may establish a minimum bid requirement.
 - B) The City Administrator or designee will complete the Abandoned Vehicle Certificate and will determine whether the vehicle meets the definition of a salvage vehicle per K.S.A. 8-197(b)(2)(A) or (B). If yes, then the City Administrator or the designee will also complete the Salvage, Non-Highway or Non-Repairable Vehicle Affidavit (Form TR-13). Copies of the affidavits are attached.

- C) After the completion of the auction and payment to the City of Marysville, the purchaser will be provided the Abandoned Vehicle Certificate and the Salvage, Non-Highway or Non-Repairable Vehicle Affidavit, if applicable, and all other required documents for titling and registration purposes. Thereafter, the purchaser shall take all financial and physical responsibility for the vehicle including without limitation, the submission of the documents to the appropriate county treasurer to obtain a certificate of title and the payment for the sales tax and any other incidental costs or fees to re-title the vehicle in the purchaser's name.
- 8. If the vehicle is not purchased at the public auction, the vehicle shall be deemed forfeited to the City of Marysville for payment toward the transportation, removal, storage publication costs and other fees incurred by the City. The City Administrator or the designee will submit the Abandoned Vehicle Affidavit, together with the documents described above, to the Marshall County Treasurer to obtain a certificate of title in the name of the City of Marysville. Upon receipt of the certificate of title, the City Administrator or the designee shall remove and dispose of the vehicle. Any proceeds received from the disposition of the vehicle shall be deposited into the General Fund. Any deficiency may be recovered by collection or special assessment on the real estate where the nuisance vehicle was removed and, in the manner as provided by K.S.A. 12-1,115 and amendments thereto.
- 9. Effective January 1, 2024, an additional step will be required of the City of Marysville. The City of Marysville will be required to complete a certificate of compliance form. See HB 2197, 2023 Session of Kansas Legislature. Under this law, the fee for this form is set at \$20.

8-1102. Motor vehicle abandoned on public highway or property open to use by public; public agency may impound; disposition; motor vehicle abandoned on private property; criminal trespass; impounding and disposition of vehicle; notice; recovery from impoundment, requirements. (a) (1) A person shall not use the public highway to abandon vehicles or use the highway to leave vehicles unattended in such a manner as to interfere with public highway operations. When a person leaves a motor vehicle on a public highway or other property open to use by the public, the public agency having jurisdiction of such highway or other property open to use by the public, after 48 hours or when the motor vehicle interferes with public highway operations, may remove and impound the motor vehicle.

(2) Any motor vehicle which has been impounded as provided in this section for 30 days or more shall be disposed of in the following manner: If such motor vehicle has displayed thereon a registration plate issued by the division of vehicles and has been registered with the division, the public agency shall request verification from the division of vehicles of the last registered owner and any lienholders, if any. Such verification request shall be submitted to the division of vehicles not more than 30 days after such agency took possession of the vehicle. The public agency shall mail a notice by certified mail to the registered owner thereof, addressed to the address as shown on the certificate of registration, and to the lienholder, if any, of record in the county in which the title shows the owner resides, if registered in this state. The notice shall state that if the owner or lienholder does not claim such motor vehicle and pay the removal and storage charges incurred by such public agency on it within 15 days from the date of the mailing of the notice, that it will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash. The notice shall be mailed within 10 days after receipt of verification of the last owner and any lienholders, if any, as provided in this subsection.

After 15 days from date of mailing notice, the public agency shall publish a notice once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where such motor vehicle was abandoned and left, which notice shall describe the motor vehicle by name of maker, model, serial number, and owner, if known, and stating that it has been impounded by the public agency and that it will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash if the owner thereof does not claim it within 10 days of the date of the second publication of the notice and pay the removal and storage charges, and publication costs incurred by the public agency. If the motor vehicle does not display a registration plate issued by the division of vehicles and is not registered with the division, the public agency after 30 days from the date of impoundment, shall request verification from the division of vehicles of the last registered owner and any lienholders, if any. Such verification request shall be submitted to the division of vehicles no more than 30 days after such agency took possession of the vehicle. The public agency shall mail a notice by certified mail to the registered owner thereof, addressed to the address as shown on the certificate of registration, and to the lienholder, if any, of record in the county in which the title shows the owner resides, if registered in this state. The notice shall state that if the owner or lienholder does not claim such motor vehicle and pay the removal and storage charges incurred by such public agency on it within 15 days from the date of the mailing of the notice, it will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash. The notice shall be mailed within 10 days after receipt of verification of the last owner and any lienholders, if any, as provided in this subsection. After 15 days from the date of mailing notice, the public agency shall publish a notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where such motor vehicle was abandoned and left, which notice shall describe the motor vehicle by name of maker, model, color and serial number and shall state that it has been impounded by said public agency and will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash, if the owner thereof does not claim it within 10 days of the date of the second publication of the notice and pay the removal and storage charges incurred by the public agency.

When any public agency has complied with the provisions of this section with respect to an abandoned motor vehicle and the owner thereof does not claim it within the time stated in the notice and pay the removal and storage charges and publication costs incurred by the public agency on such motor vehicle, the public agency may sell the motor vehicle at public auction to the highest bidder for cash.

- (3) After any sale pursuant to this section, the purchaser may file proof thereof with the division of vehicles, and the division shall issue a certificate of title to the purchaser of such motor vehicle. All moneys derived from the sale of motor vehicles pursuant to this section, after payment of the expenses of the impoundment and sale, shall be paid into the fund of the public agency which is used by it for the construction or maintenance of highways.
- (b) Any person who abandons and leaves a vehicle on real property, other than public property or property open to use by the public, which is not owned or leased by such person or by the owner or lessee of such vehicle shall be guilty of criminal trespass, as defined in K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 21-5808, and amendments thereto, and upon request of the owner or occupant of such real property, the public agency in whose jurisdiction such property is situated may remove and dispose of such vehicle in the manner provided in subsection (a), except that the provisions of subsection (a) requiring that a motor vehicle be abandoned for a period of time in excess of 48 hours prior to its removal shall not be applicable to abandoned vehicles which are subject to the provisions of this subsection. Any person removing such vehicle from the real property at the request of such public agency shall have a possessory lien on such vehicle for the costs incurred in removing, towing and storing such vehicle.
- (c) Whenever any motor vehicle has been left unattended for more than 48 hours or when any unattended motor vehicle interferes with public highway operations, any law enforcement officer is hereby authorized to move such vehicle or cause to have the vehicle moved as provided in K.S.A. <u>8-1103</u> et seq., and amendments thereto.
- (d) The notice provisions of this section shall apply to any motor vehicle which has been impounded as provided in K.S.A. <u>8-1567</u>, and amendments thereto.
- (e) Any person attempting to recover a motor vehicle impounded as provided in this section or in accordance with a city ordinance or county resolution providing for the impoundment of motor vehicles, shall show proof of valid registration and ownership of the motor vehicle to the public agency before obtaining the motor vehicle. In addition, the public agency may require payment of all reasonable costs associated with the impoundment of the motor vehicle, including transportation and storage fees, prior to release of the motor vehicle.

2003 Syssion Law John Lands / Chapter 52, House Bill 2147

CHAPTER 52

House Bill No. 2147

(Amended by Chapter 91)

Au Act concerning motor vehicles; relating to abandoned or towed vehicles; requiring a person providing wrecker or towing service or agency to provide a certification of compliance to a purchaser upon the sale and transfer of an abandoned or towed vehicle; modifying requirements for certified mail notices to prior owners of abandoned or towed vehicles; relating to the uniform act regulating traffic on highways; creating the crime of knowingly or intentionally manufacturing, importing, distributing, selling, offering for sale, installing or reinstalling counterfeit supplemental restraint system components and nonfunctional airbags and providing criminal penalties for violation thereof; expanding permitted lighting equipment on vehicles to include all ground effect lighting; amending K.S.A. 8-1102, 8-1103, 8-1104 and 8-1723 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) A public agency or person providing wrecker or towing service shall provide a certification of compliance to a purchaser upon the sale and transfer of a vehicle pursuant to K.S.A. 8-1102 and 8-1103, and amendments thereto. A certification of compliance shall allow such purchaser to apply for and receive a certificate of title from the division of vehicles that is free and clear of all liens, security interests and encumbrances.

- (b) A certification of compliance shall be completed on a form and in a manner approved by the secretary of revenue, or the secretary's designee. Such certification of compliance shall certify that the requirements of K.S.A. 8-1102 through 8-1104, and amendments thereto, have been met by the public agency or person providing wrecker or towing service. The certification of compliance form shall be subject to a fee of \$20. All certification of compliance fees collected by the division of vehicles, a contractor or a county treasurer pursuant to this subsection shall be retained by the entity who processed the certification of compliance form.
- (c) Certification of compliance fees prescribed by subsection (b) may be applied to the purchaser as part of the sale of a vehicle pursuant to K.S.A. 8-1102 and 8-1103, and amendments thereto. Certification of compliance fees may be applied to the owner of the vehicle if such owner claims the vehicle from a public agency or person providing wrecker or towing service prior to the vehicle being sold at public auction.
- (d) A certification of compliance provided for in this section shall also certify that vehicle identification number inspection requirements have been met for any sales of vehicles that are registered or titled in a jurisdiction outside of Kansas in accordance with K.S.A. 8-116a, and amendments thereto.
- (e) The provisions of this section shall take effect on and after January 1, 2024.

New Sec. 2. (a) No person shall knowingly or intentionally manufacture, import, distribute, sell, offer for sale, install or reinstall a device intended to replace a supplemental restraint system component if the device is:

- (1) A counterfeit supplemental restraint system component;
- (2) a nonfunctional airbag; or
- (3) any object in lieu of a supplemental restraint system component that was not designed in accordance with federal safety regulations for the make, model and year of the motor vehicle in which such device is or will be installed.
- (b) Violation of subsection (a) shall be a class A nonperson misdemeanor.
- (c) As used in this section:
- (1) "Airbag" means a motor vehicle inflatable occupant restraint system device that is part of a supplemental restraint system.
- (2) "Counterfeit supplemental restraint system component" means a replacement supplemental restraint system component that displays a mark identical or substantially similar to the genuine mark of a motor vehicle manufacturer or a supplier of parts to the manufacturer of a motor vehicle without authorization from that manufacturer or supplier.
- (3) "Nonfunctional airbag" means a replacement airbag that:
- (A) Was previously deployed or damaged;
- (B) has an electric fault that is detected by the motor vehicle's diagnostic systems when the installation procedure is completed and the motor vehicle is returned to the customer who requested the work to be performed or when ownership is intended to be transferred;
- (C) includes a part or object, including a supplemental restraint system component, installed in a motor vehicle to mislead the owner or operator of the motor vehicle into believing that a functional airbag has been installed; or
- (D) is prohibited from being sold or leased in accordance with 49 U.S.C. § 30120(j).
- (4) "Supplemental restraint system" means a passive inflatable motor vehicle occupant crash protection system designed for use in conjunction with active restraint systems as described in 49 C.F.R. § 571.208. A supplemental restraint system includes:
- (A) Each airbag installed in accordance with the motor vehicle manufacturer's design; and
- (B) all components required to ensure that an airbag operates as designed in the event of a crash and in accordance with the federal motor vehicle safety standards for the specific make, model and year of the motor vehicle.

- (B) a late model vehicle which is of a type required to be registered in this state and which has been wrecked or damaged to the extent that the total cost of repair at retail is 75% or more of the fair market value of the motor vehicle immediately preceding the time it was wrecked or damaged and such condition was not merely exterior cosmetic damage to such vehicle as a result of windstorm or hail.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 14-101 OF THE 2020 CODE OF THE CITY OF MARYSVILLE, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF MARYSVILLE, KANSAS:

Section 1. Section 14-101 of the 2020 Code of the City of Marysville hereby is amended to read as follows:

14-101. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Marysville, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," edition of 2023, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed. No fewer than three copies of the Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1921," with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the article shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of the Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2. Ordinance 1908 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Marysville, Kansas, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities," edition of 2023, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed. No fewer than three copies of the Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1922, "with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.

Section 2. Ordinance 1909 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.



RE: Employee Health Insurance

Earlier this month, we were informed that the city of Marysville would no longer be able to be on the current health insurance plan provided by Blue Cross and Blue Shield. The main reason for this change is that in 2022 we did not have enough staff hours (51 FTE) to qualify for the large group plan. The city is being moved down to a small group plan until we can again attain the 51 FTE. What this means is that the price of health insurance will go up for the next year by about \$40,000, based on the recommended plan, over all funds(Employee Benefits, Water, Sewer, and Library).

Included are the plan options that staff reviewed for the next year. The recommendation from staff is to go with the 1500/25 Gold plan which has a max out of pocket of \$4950 and a Coinsurance of 20%. We did try to get a quote from KMIT on their relatively new health insurance pool, but they determined the city of Marysville was too high a risk to include in their pool currently.

Our health insurance plan goes from October to September, so Blue Cross and Blue Shield is expecting an answer by September 1.

Summary Recommendation:

The Marysville Police Department requests approval to order a 2024 Dodge Durango from Nemaha Valley Motors of Seneca in the amount of \$41,310.00, with upfitting provided by KaComm of Manhattan, in the amount of \$11,500.00. The total combined price of \$52,810.00. There is a 120–150-day delivery term right now through Dodge. As such, we are requesting approval to order the item now, with delivery early next year. Additionally, the sooner we order, we can lock in the price and not experience any price increases.

On the very slim chance that the vehicle comes in prior to January 1st (highly unlikely), Nemaha Valley Motors has agreed to hold the vehicle on their lot based on the preorder, until next fiscal year.

We will run this expenditure through the Municipal Equipment Reserve fund so as not to affect this year's General Fund Budget. We would then pay the Municipal Equipment Reserve fund back in 2024 from the General Fund.

Executive Summary:

In August 2023, the MPD solicited bids from Honeyman Ford of Marysville, Nordhus Motors of Marysville, and Nemaha Valley Motors of Seneca.

We are requesting the Dodge Durango specifically based upon several reasons. First, it's the only vehicle available currently.

More importantly, the Durango comes with a pre-installed police spotlight on the driver's side of the vehicle. The Explorer does not. To add one to an Explorer, is approximately \$850.00 as an additional cost through an upfitter. A Chevy Tahoe does include a pre-installed police spotlight, but that vehicle is near \$48,000, significantly more than the Durango and out of our price range in previous years.

Additionally, based on the 2023 models that we have right now, the Durango has a much larger backup camera. This assists the officers in backing into tight spaces and avoiding collisions. The Explorer does have a backup camera also, but not to the quality or size of the Durango. Last, the storage room in the rear of the Durango for equipment is larger. This allows a more user-friendly storage compartment area for the various tools that law enforcement carries. In time of an emergency, easy access to equipment is paramount to our success as first responders.

It is also important to note that the officers prefer the Durango for comfort and maneuverability. The three Dodge Durangos that we have currently come with high praise from the assigned staff, and we've received numerous compliments on their appearance. All around, our request is for a Dodge Durango.
